
PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD U. S.


In 1859, J. McBride hits shore of lake, set a meander post and made the following B.T.'s: Birch, 8", S.21°E., 8 links (5.28 feet); Birch, 10", N.57°W., 7 links (4.62 feet).


In 1946, H. Crawford, G.L.O. Surveyor, found no corner evidence. Set a G.L.O. concrete monument at record distances and made the following B.T.'s: Elm, 8", S.07°W., 38 links (25.08 feet); Birch 12", N.29"W., 3 links (1.98 feet).

In 1988, A. Harrison found corner as per Crawford with Elm B.T. dead and down. Made new references.
