
U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system.
 O = Corner monument restored.

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.


In 1859, J. McBride set quarter post and made the following B.T.'s: Tamarack, 12", S.08°W., 23 links (15.18 feet); Birch, 7", N.46°E., 17 links (11.22 feet).

In 1946, H. Crawford, G.L.O. Surveyor, found original tamarack B.T. Set G.L.O. monument and made the following B.T.'s: Y. Birch, 7", N. 70 3/4°W., 32 links (21.12 feet); Elm, 5", S.43°E., 21 1/2 links (14.19 feet).

In 1977, J. Resvick, R.L.S., found corner as per Crawford.

In 1988, A. Harrison found corner as per Crawford and added new references.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, iron orother equally durable material.)
- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference ties which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. Indicate north.
 - 1. 6" concrete monument with brass cap.
 - 2. W. Birch, 12", N.11°E., 62.83 feet.
 - 3. R. Maple, 7", S.69°E., 36.15 feet.
 - 4. Y. Birch, 8", N.73°W., 20.88 feet.
 - 5. Steel sign post, Northwest, 0.65 feet.
