
INSTRUCTIONS:

(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.


In 1859, James Mc Bride set wood post with the following B.T.'s: Hemlock, 10", S.77°E., 21 links (13.86 feet); Birch, 10", N.23°W., 34 links (22.44 feet).

In 1937, A.J. Vronch (C.C.C.) found a squared Hemlock post in good condition. No original B.T.'s were found. Placed a metal location poster on the South side of a 8" Hemlock from which the corner bears S.16°E., 0.12 chains (7.92 feet).

In 1962, Resvick found a 3/8" iron pipe, 3" above ground and squared post. No evidence of original B.T.'s found.

On November 18, 1991, Alan D. Harrison (R.L.S.) found 3/8" iron pipe 3" above ground as per Resvick. Located Vronch's Hemlock B.T. which is now a rotten stump and found location tag under duff. Found no evidence of original B.T.'s remaining. Repalced iron pipe with monument as best evidence of corner location.

- (c) In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron orother equally durable material.)

- 4. Sugar, 7", N.58°W., 21.10 feet.
- 5. Steel Sign Post, 6', West, 0.8 feet.
