
U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through I).

(a) identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O = Corner monument restored.

Quarter corner to Sections 20 and 21 T.35N., R.14E. Forest County, Wisconsin.




(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859, James Mc Bride set original post with the following B.T.'s: Hemlock, 12", N.67°W., 24 links (15.84 feet); Birch, 15", N.86°E., 14 links (9.24 feet).

In 1936, A.J. Vronch, (C.C.C.) found cedar post in good condition and original Hemlock B.T. Placed metal location poster on East side of 16" maple, from which corner bears S.85°E., 15 links (9.90 feet).

On November 12, 1991, Alan D. Harrison (R.L.S.) found 17" maple with old blazes and recovered location poster dated in 1936 on ground at base of tree. At S.84°E., 9.90 feet, found post hole and post remains. In post hole placed monument as best evidence of corner location.

- (c) In the pian view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, If the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron orother equally durable material.)
- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference tles which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. Indicate north.
