

In 1859 James McBride established this corner and set a wood post with BTs: 12" Hemlock, N72°E, 47 Links 12" Birch, S28°W, 49 Links

16" Birch, S12°E, 36 Links 10" Lynn, N86°W, 6 Links


5/9/89 - We found evidence of restorations in the past, a large pine stump with "BT" scribe clear. A recently cut off fence post. From this area we have evidence of the Hemlock BT, N72°E, 31.0'; the Birch, S12°E, 23.8' and the Birch S28°W, 34.5'. We restore this corner from the remains of these three original BTs. No record of who or when the large pine stump was scribed. Looks to be the Smith or Melindy era, however.
