


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1859 corner was established by James McBride. He set a wood post for the corner and made two BTs: Hemlock, 8", S.10°W., 12 Links and Hemlock, 6", N.23°W., 18 Links.

1936 - Forest Service has an 874 stating corner was resurveyed by Rifleman. He placed a location poster on an Aspen stake.

On 5/14/1990 Milo E. Stefan found a mound of stone with post hole in center with the location poster lying in duff 3 feet Northeast of mound of stone. I accept this location as the restored corner location and monumented same to subdivide Section 26.
