





In 1859, James McBride set 4 section post with the following BTs: Linn, 14", N.67°E., 19 links; Elm, 16", S.84°W., 57 links.

In 1909, Smith found original stumps with iron marks. Made the following new BTs: Sugar, 6". S.66½°E., 9 links; Hemlock, 10", N.57°E., 27 links.

August 31, 1984, USDA-FS, found a Forest County brass cap 2' above ground, set by S-887 (T. Arnott). Found Smith's BTs: Sugar (alive), 22", S.66°E., 5.94' and decayed Hemlock stump, N.57°E., 17.82'. Found stump holes at N.67°E., 12.54' and at S.84°W., 37.62' for original BTs. Old fence line north and west.
