
INSTRUCTIONS:


In 1934, J. W. White (874) found stake in good condition. Tag on 10" Elm. Believed to be original.


May 7, 1969, Resvick found squared post rotted off; piece of reinforcing rod on north side of post point.

October 24, 1984, Alan Harrison found corner, as found by Resvick. From post point and iron bar at N.24°W., 27.7', stump hole; at N.18°E., 34.3', stump hole; at S.38°E., 23.1', turned out tree--fell north.
