




## U. S. PUBLIC LAND SURVEY MONUMENT RECORD

INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through ().

(a) identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O - Corner monument restored.

> Section Corner to sections 26-27-34-35, T.35N., R.16E., Forest County, Wisconsin.




(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set a wood post with the following B.T.'s: Elm, 12", N.02°W., 56 links (36.96 feet); Sugar, 15", N.80°E., 46 links (30.36 feet); Sugar, 15", S.30°E., 36 links (23.76 feet); Sugar, 15", S.49°W., 13 links (20.46 feet).

In 1990, Alan D. Harrison (RLS) searched and found no evidence of corner, corner restored by double proportionate measure.

- If the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments, (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron prother equally durable material.)
- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference tles which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. Indicate north.

  - Sugar, 8", N.12°E., 32.35 feet.
  - Sugar, 8", S.63°E., 40.23 feet.
  - Sugar, 9", S.63°W., 28.91 feet.
  - Sugar, 4", N.33°W., 33.49 feet.
  - Steel Sign Post, 6', Northwest, 0.65 feet.


