

July 23, 2001 - Surveyor 2197 - Michael A. Treml - restored the corner through acceptance of obliterated evidence, and set a stamped Forest County aluminum monument.

September 13, 2021 - I found a 2 1/2" diameter aluminum pipe with a 3 1/4" diameter aluminum capped Forest County aluminum monument stamped to identify the corner, leaning west. I straightened the monument, and reset its position from previously measured distances to: the Northeast Corner of Section 27, and to the Center 1/4 Corner Section 26, and the existing utility pole witness established by Treml.
