




In 1858, Alfred Millard, D.S., set post with the following BT's: Hemlock 8" - N35°E - 23 links Sugar 10" - S18°W - 22 links December 22, 1992, John R. Garske found 2 1/2" O.D. iron pipe with a 2 1/2" brass cap. Approximtely 3' above ground. Brass cap stamped: Forest Co. Forest Crop, T36N, R13E, 1/4 cor., S13, S18, 9-1-38, C.E. Walker. No record of his notes can be found.

I accepted the Walker monument as being in the best location for the 1/4 comer after discussing Mr. Walker's work with other local surveyors and finding him to generally have done quality work.


