

In 1859 James Mc Bride set a wood post and marked B.T.s as follows; Hemlock 12" N.27 W. 15 lks., Hemlock 12" N.61 E. 9 lks.

In 1973 Jean Reavick found an ancient wood stake in mound of stone; replaced stake with 2" iron pipe with cap and marked B.T. as follows; W.Birch 5" S.28 E. 12.88', W.Birch 6" N.60 W. 8.78'; he also found remains of both B.T.s.

In 1986 I found corner marked by a 2" iron pipe with cap in mound of stone; found a very old 3" sq. wood stake lying by pipe; found existing B.T.s as follow; W.Birch 7" S.30 E. 12.8', W.Birch 7" N.61 W. 8.8'; I accept this position as correct; referenced as shown below.


