
In 1859 James McBride set a wood post at this corner location and scribed the following bearing trees:

N 29°W 4 links Sugar N 52°E 15 links Sugar S 45°E 60 links Sugar s 76°W 18 links Sugar

In 1980, Bill Cochrane found a 3" iron pipe in a mound of stone and a decayed Sugar 60 links. He set a 2½" aluminum post with cap stamped for the corner in place of the iron pipe and marked a 9" Basswood and a 14" Cherry.

I found Cochrane's monument in good condition with the Basswood now a 14" tree and the Cherry a 16" tree. I scribed and blazed two more trees as shown below.

O = Corner monument restored.



The monument consists of a 2½" aluminum post with cap stamped for the corner. Distances are to nails in the tree centers which trees are blazed and scribed. Bearings are magnetic.
