History of original corner establishment, record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence, and what you found and how the monument was set.

In 1859 James McBride set a wood post at this corner location and scribed the following trees: Aspen 6" S 28°E 15 links and an Aspen 8" N 49°W 26 links

In 1915 J. Melendy resurveyed Section 11 and found the original BTs and marked the following new BTs: Pine 18" N 41°E 57 1/8 links

Pine 14" N 86 같은 33 ½ links W. Birch 12" N 81½ W 12 ½ links Maple 10" S 45 3/4 W 21½ links

In 1976 Philip Hansen recovered an old wood post and an old BT on a Birch 14" N 80°W for 12.5 links. He set an aluminum Forest County Monument up 12" in place of the post.

I redovered Hansen's monument and his BTs all in good condition, but the monument was unstable. I set it further in the ground for stability and set a steel sign post near the corner painting and signing his BTs. Melendy's distances north and south fit the distances which I returned remarkably well.

In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, if the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (Witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, iron or other equally durable material, except wood other than bearing trees.) Also, show any material discrepancies between the corner restored or re-established and the location of any other previous corner location or occupation.

The corner consists of an aluminum Forest County monument. Distances are to nails driven into the tree centers which trees are scribed and blazed to USFS standard. Bearings are magnetic.
