

In 1859 James McBride set a wood post at this corner location and scribed the following bearing trees:

Elm 10'' S 04°E 6 links Elm 10'' S 47°W 31 links

In 1979 Milo Stefan found a wood post point in a mound of stone and two dead Elm stumps at the BT locations. He set a 2" iron pipe with brass cap stamped for corner in place of the old post and marked a 10" Hemlock, 22" White Pine, 11" Hemlock and set a steel sign post SE 0.5 ft.

I found Milo's iron pipe in good condition with the steel post knocked down. The 10" Hemlock was now 14", the White Pine was 24" and the other Hemlock was 14". I reset the sign post and marked another BT as shown below.
