
INSTRUCTIONS:

This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system.

O = Corner monument restored.

Section Corner Common to Sections 29, 30, 31 & 32, T.36N., R.16E., Forest County, Wisconsin.




(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

In 1858, James McBride set a wood post and the following B.T.'s: Sugar, 12", N.27°E.,
10 links (6.60 feet), Linden, 20", N.48°W., 30 links (19.80 feet), Sugar, 14", S.32°E.,
41 links (27.06 feet), Hemlock, 24", S.77°W., 38 links (25.08 feet). North, 41.90 chains,
stream 100 links wide, runs East.

In 1911, J. Melindy found the corner and all of the original bearing trees. Sugar, 20", N.27°E., 6.60 feet, Linden, 30", N.43°W., 19.80 feet, Sugar, 20", S.32°E., 27.06 feet, Hemlock (stump) 30", S.77°W., 25.08 feet. Set 4"x4"x48" ironwood post.

On May 4, 1993, Alan D. Harrison (RLS) found a large Basswood stump with 4 proginies growing out. Two proginies still alive with 16" and 18" live trees. From center of Basswood pulled S.43°E., 19.80 feet and found posthole and post remains from which the following bear; Sugar stump, N.27°E., 6.60 feet, stump depression, S.32°E., 27.06 feet, stump depression, S.77°W., 25.08 feet. Accepted post hole and accessories as best evidence of corner location.
