History of original corner establishment:

In 1858, Original Government surveyed by Alfred Millard. Set a wood post with the following corner references: Tamarack 5" N50°W 134 lks. Tamarack 5" N59°E 25 1ks. Tamarack 5" S20°E 4 lks. Tamarack 5" S57°W 136 1ks.

Description of corner evidence found:

In 1937, corner determined from the remains of the original bearing trees by the GLO surveyors. Set a 2" dia. iron post with a brass cap stamped to identify the corner. The following corner references: Tamarack 6" N54°E 82 1ks. Tamarack 6" S71½°E 145 1ks. Tamarack 5" S40°W 34 1ks. Tamarack 5" N77 3/4°W 93 1ks:

In 1971, Jean Resvick recovered monument in place.

In 1989, John Schulke recovered monument in place. Recovered Tamarack 6" S39°W 22.29 ft. and a steel sign post West 1.0 ft. from the monument.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

Blazed, scribed, tagged and painted the following new bearing trees: Tamarack 3" S07°W 32.55 ft.

40.84 ft. Tamarack West

21.19 ft. N34°E Tamarack

Tamarack 30.16 ft. S80°E


