
This record shall show the location of the corner and shall include all of the following nine elements (a through 1).

(a) Identify the corner by reference to the U.S. public land survey system. O . Corner monument restored.


Corner common to Sections 34 and 35, T37N-R16E, and Sections 2 and 3, T36N-R16E

- (b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.
 - 1857 Original wood post set by Artemas Curtis, witnessed by 15 Tamarack N83W 96 1ks.; 14 Tamarack NO8E 86 1ks.; 14 Tamarack S75W 23 1ks.
 - 1930 Notes of Goodman Lumber Co. indicate quarter corner common to Sections 2 and 3 was set by proportionate method between section corners 1/2-mile to North and South. No record given for corner on town line, but is assumed to have been monumented at that time.
 - 1934 CCC (Forest Service) record by J.W. White as existing stake north and west of creek. No recovery of OBTs or marking of NBTs was noted.
 - 1991 Found 2" x 5' iron pipe 15" below surface in beaver marsh at edge of 5' wide stream; pipe is similar to other Goodman monuments recovered. Position is substantially in line with corners ½-mile and 1 mile South in agreement with Goodman proportionate measure. Position is 7.3 feet North and 11.8 feet West of midpoint between section corners 1 mile to East and West. Accepted monument as most probable position of true corner.
- In the plan view drawing below, provide reference ties to at least 4 witness monuments, or, If the location is within a municipality, to at least 2 witness monuments. (witness monuments shall be made of concrete, natural stone, Iron orother equally durable material.)
- (d) Show a plan view drawing depicting the relevent monuments and reference tles which is sufficient in detail to enable accurate relocation of the corner monument if the corner monument is disturbed. indicate north.
- 1. 2½" x 120" Aluminum monument with location stamped on cap.
- 2. Black Spruce 9" S62°E 136.32 feet.
- 3. White Birch 7" S44°E 147.62 feet.
- 4. Black Spruce 4" N65°W 106.28 feet.
- 5. Tamarack 8" N19°W 99.90 feet.
- 6. Steel sign post North 2.00 feet.



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(e) Describe any material discrepancy between the location of the corner as restored or reestablished and the location of that corner as previously restored or reestablished by distance and direction. Show the discrepancy on the plan view drawing under (d), above. Show the distances between the corner as previously restored or reestablished and (i) the corner as restored or reestablished, and (2) to at least 2 of the witness monuments shown on the drawing in (d), above.
