Set a wooden post with the following bearing trees:

Birch 12" S43°W 25 1ks.
Birch 8" N32°E 37 1ks.

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Description of corner evidence found:

Found no evidence in 1988.

In July 1934, John Lindley Ruby, Junior Forestor, found a wood post at the corner in fair condition. He placed a metal tag on a 12" Hemlock 4 feet West of the corner.

Description of monument and accessories I established to perpetuate the original location of this corner.

Set a 2 1/2" diameter aluminum pipe monument, 3 feet long, 2 feet in the ground, with an aluminum cap stamped: T38N, R14E, 1/4, S10, S15, 1988, S-1665. Established the following corner references: 14" Cedar N16°E 20.14 ft. Yellow Birch N66°E 26.89 ft. Hemlock S82°W 16.09 ft. chiseled "X" on Boulder 4'X4' S42°E 25.88 ft. Steel sign post West 1.0 ft.


