


On 4-22-98, Alan Harrison, RLS with the U.S. Forest Service, searched the corner area using Global Positioning Satellite control. No corner evidence was recovered. The corner position is reestablished using lost corner proportionate methods. At the corner position set a 2 1/2 inch diameter aluminum pipe monument, 3 feet long, 2 1/2 feet in the ground, with an aluminum cap stamped; T.38N., R.14E., S.17, S.18, S.19, S.20, 1998, R.L.S. 1651. Blazed and scribed new bearing trees as noted below.


