



In 1949 Consolidated Papers Inc. recovered wood post and bearing trees.

In 1976, Phil Hansen, RLS with Consolidateded Papers Inc. found wood post and local bearing trees. Replaced post with a 2 1/2 inch diameter Bernsten A-1 Federal Monument, stamped as follows; S-498, T.39N, R.14E, Sec., 19, 20, 29, 30, 1975. Blazed and scribed a new bearing tree; Cedar, 5", N.45°E., 43.3 links (28.57 feet).
