


(b) Describe any record evidence, monument evidence, occupational evidence, testimonial evidence or any other material evidence you considered, and whether the monument was found or placed.

Original Government Survey in 1865 by H.& J.L. Nowlin. North between sections 19 and 20, at 40.00 chains, set wood post from which the following bear: Linden, 15", N.35°W., 5 links, Ironwood, 6", S.52°E., 8 links.

On March 13, 1995, William B. Cochrane, RLS with the U.S. Forest Service, found a 4" squared wood post alongside a 1" diameter iron pipe. He accepted the post and pipe as the best available evidence for restoring the corner position. Set a 2 ½" diameter aluminum pipe monument, 3 feet long, 2 ½ feet in the ground, with an aluminum cap stamped; T.38N. R.14E.,1/4, S.19, S.20,1995, S-1107. Blazed and scribed the bearing trees as noted below. Note: Cochrane did not file a Land Corner Restoration Certificate

On June 24,2002, Alan D. Harrison, RLS with the U.S. Forest Service, found monument and accessories as set by Cochrane in 1995. Blazed and scribed an additional bearing tree as described below.
