


Original Government Survey in 1865 by H. & J.L. Nowlin. Set wood post from which the following bear; Tamarack, 8", N.21°W., 23 links, Tamarack, 8", S.87°E. 20 links.

In 1967, Jean Resvick, RLS with the U.S. Forest Service found a squared cedar post and and original bearing tree evidence. Set a 2 inch diameter galvanized iron pipe 5 feet long with a brass cap marked; T38N., R14E., S20, S21, 1967, S - 802. Blazed and scribed the following; Tamarack, 7", N.50°E., 56.20 feet, Cedar, 3", S.34°E. 27.83 feet, Tamarack, 4", N.65°W., 18.04 feet.

In 1989, Gary Pisoni, RLS, blazed and scribed 1 new bearing tree; Cedar, 8", S.61°W. 5.65 feet.

On 9-22-97, Alan Harrison, RLS with the U.S. Forest Service, found monument and accessories as set above. Cut down all but Northeast bearing tree for GPS observations. Blazed and scribed new bearing trees as noted below.




