

In 1865 James L. Nowlin set wood post with the following BTs: Fir, 8", N40°W, 10 links; Ash, 12", S36°E, 21 links.

Found 1-1/4" iron pipe and pointed tip of wood post along side, blazed line North and South. Found Ash 9", N50°W, 7.2 feet as called for ny John L. Ruby in 1934.

Replaced 1-1/4" iron pipe with 2" diameter aluminum pipe 5 feet long with 3" diameter aluminum tablet stamped to identify corner.
