

SURVEY NOTES

This survey was made by Gary L. Pisoni, a Registered Land Surveyor in the State of Wisconsin, for the U.S.D.A., Forest Service, for the purpose of recovering, restoring, establishing, marking, and perpetuating the corners and boundary lines of U.S. Government Land on the perimeter and within Section 21, Township 37 North, Range 15 East, Fourth Principal Meridian, Forest County, State of Wisconsin, as shown on the plat map herewith.

The Original Government Township Lines was done Artemas Curtis, U.S. Deputy Surveyor in October of 1857. The original Government Sub-division of this township was done by J.L. Nowlin, U.S. Deputy Surveyor in August of 1865.

The bearings between corner positions are true bearings referenced to the East section line of Section 20, as determined by a solar observation by Jean F. Resvick RLS. (U.S.F.S.) from a Plat of Survey of 1977 of Section 20. All distances shown thereon are in feet and hundredths of feet. The control traverse was measured by use of an electronic distance measuring equipment.

The accuracy of this survey exceeds the State requirements of 1 in 3000.

The field notes and a copy of the Plat of Survey are on file in the Forest Supervisor's Office at Rhinelander, Wisconsin.
